Evaluation plan: CORE

Evaluation goals

Document the impact of outreach programs on engaging and retaining people in care.

Cross-site research questions

• Approximately how long, and what level of effort does it take to get someone engaged in HIV-oriented primary care, and what factors are associated with engagement?

• What level of effort does it take to keep someone retained in HIVoriented primary care, and what factors are associated with retention?

• What are the characteristics of clients who are engaged in HIVoriented primary care, versus those who are not engaged in care?

 What are the characteristics of clients who are retained in HIV-oriented primary care, versus those who are not retained in care?

• Are there differences in barriers and facilitators among individuals engaged and not engaged in HIV-oriented primary care?

• Are there differences in barriers and facilitators among individuals retained and not retained in HIV-oriented primary care?

• Does participation in case management facilitate a client's engagement and retention in HIV-oriented primary care?

• Is the level of retention in care associated with changes in key medical outcomes?

• Are individuals who are retained in HIV-oriented primary care more likely to show improvement in quality of life?

Evaluation design

Phase 1-Varies according to local evaluation plans:

- Longitudinal
- Pre/post
- No control groups, no comparison groups

Phase 2-Longitudinal

Evaluation methods

Ouantitative

- Individual-level data across 17 sites
- Aggregate program data

Oualitative

- Program change log
- Analysis of agency characteristics
- Analysis of the process of engagement

Sample (Drawn from local samples)

HIV-positive individuals

- Newly diagnosed
- Sporadic users of care
- Lost to follow-up

Key variables

Independent

- Outreach-length, level of effort, location, who, content, type
- Demographics
- Engagement
- Retention
- Case management

Dependent

- Engagement
- Retention
- Barriers
- Medical outcomes
- Quality of life

Current status of evaluation: In progress

Change between Phase I and Phase II: Depends on data received during Phase I
